Music Mark Schools 2023/2024 is open for invitations

It's that time of year again! As part of the Music Mark Schools programme, we invite schools to a year of events, training, resources and more, for free.

The Music Mark Schools Programme is a fully subsidised member benefit and is available to all Music Hub/Service members including those in Northern Ireland, Wales and the Crown Dependencies so please do make use of this if you are able. A Common Approach

A <u>Common Approach</u> is an online resource to support music educators in their teaching practice and help develop a holistic approach to music education. Relevant to all vocal and instrumental teaching, music educators at all stages of their career can use the support and shared learning found in A Common Approach.

Having added sections for djembe, bass guitar, and Latin American percussion in Spring this year, there is a new instrumental addition – the Tabla! A Common Approach Editor Catherine Brentnall and contributor Harjit Singh highlight the importance of expanding the resource. <u>See video here</u>

Christmas Cracker

Each year, hundreds of primary school children join in singing Christmas songs, both old and new, some known, others less so.

Themed a 'Christmas Cracker' for 2023, this years vocal event workshops/rehearsals & performances take place on November 28th, 29th and 30th in the Walsall Arena. Audience tickets always sell quickly, so as soon as they go on sale we'll let you know. *Please note that all school places are now taken.*

Meet the Music

If you've already booked onto 'Christmas Cracker', we are holding a 'meet the music' session with director Ula Weber on Sept 13th and 14th at 4pm. This is the same event held twice (to help with timetabling and availability), you are not expected to come to both!

Network groups

We are blessed with two music network support groups, both run brilliantly by Steph Dufty: <u>MinimusE</u> and <u>MusE</u>.

These network groups support each other with CPD, generally peer led, sometimes externally and funded by the Hub. The groups develop and shape region wide events such as the World Music Days, Transition and Leadership Events like Music Mash Up, Orchestral Days such as Orchestra of the Swan, and vocal like The Big Sing or the Junior and Infant Singing Festivals.

These groups, generally set their own agendas and lead the Hub in the direction of the support and training they need. From this we have had sessions on Deep Dive training, bespoke Charanga training, moderation days for KS4 and 5, vocal workshop training, compositional techniques and SEND focussed support, among other things.

Open for applications now, this years project continues to develop our compositional offering to young composers. And now to music coordinators and music teachers alike, a tailored Inset prior to the project proper starting in January.

The project takes four paintings currently on display at the <u>New Art Gallery Walsall</u>, and with insightful artistic comments from Rob Conway (resident art educationalist), and meaningful analysis from the Hubs resident composer Nick Dewhurst, students start to understand how images can be interpreted as musical compositions. The Staff Inset running upto the pupils engagement pre-empts the work covered at the Art Gallery, so that staff have a more full understanding of how to help their students develop well rounded pieces.
