£160m "black hole" in music education funding In May 2024, Music Mark commissioned an independent think tank, Demos, to cost the English National Plan for Music Education. This research would allow us to understand the full costs associated with the government's National Plan and therefore the real level of

MEHEM Conference 2025: Cultivating Creativity

Demos has revealed that the government has inherited a "black hole" in its budget for music education amounting to a £161.4m shortfall. Researchers found that the National Plan for Music Education was short of £32.3m per year to cover the costs of regional Music Hubs – partnerships of music services, music departments, venues, clubs and other organisations. A total of £161.4m in new and hidden costs is needed over the next five years to ensure the

future of music education.
